Block F' Public Meeting

The Manager of the University Endowment Lands will be sending our application for the rezoning of Block F to a 'Public Meeting' on Tuesday May 31st at the UBC Golf Club. There will be an 'open house' from 4:30 - 6:30pm followed by a formal meeting from 6:30 – 9:30pm. The meetings are open to the general public and will be advertised to all residents of UEL and the surrounding community. This rezoning is being led by Musqueam Capital Corp. and its consultant team and we encourage all Musqueam members to attend this event and show your support.

The open house will allow the public to view the project 'story boards' along with the scaled model of the completed development and to talk with our team about all aspects of the project. The formal meeting is part of the 'statutory' or required process that allows the Minister of Community Sport and Culture to formally rezone property after considering the comments from the general public at this meeting.

We have been working towards the rezoning of these lands for several years and feel that we are now very close to finalizing this process.

The development incorporates the Preservation and enhancement of open space, Sustainability, Community integration and respect, Housing diversity, Responsible development and Building a community heart. The success of this project will make a significant contribution towards the economic independence of Musqueam. At the same time, it preserves and enhances the natural environment, provides for community, a sense of place that reflects who we are as a nation.

The Musqueam Indian Band is seeking a Coordinator, Treaty, Lands & Resources to cover for a one year maternity leave.

Reporting to the Associate Director of Treaty, Lands/Resources & Divisional Lead of Intergovernmental Affairs, the Coordinator is an integral part of the Treaty Department and Management team. The Coordinator develops and reviews policy related to treaty, lands and resources and provides internal and external support on policy, programs and administrative issues related to Musqueam Treaty, Lands and Resources.

Developing and maintaining relationships across government and non-governmental institutions and organizations, the Coordinator will also review and assess incoming referrals; facilitate large negotiation files related to rights and title by disseminating information and acting as one of the main points of contact.

A summary of other duties include:

- Provide advice and support services on:
 - Policy relating to First Nation relationships in the field of treaty, lands and resources
 - Research on legal and academic
- · Review and analyze incoming referrals
- Engage in research, analysis, policy development and implementation of Musqueam Treaty policies as delegated by Intergovernmental Affairs Divisional Lead/Associate Director.
- Support and participate in negotiations as part of the Musqueam negotiation team on key aspects of consultation and accommodation
- Identifies the range of issues to be negotiated by:
 - Assisting the Negotiators to identify the range of issues to be negotiated and formulating negotiations strategies through consultation with senior management and negotiation team.
 - Leading or participating in working groups with senior management and/or political representatives concerning issues that will be negotiated by Musqueam; coordinating research processes and activities.
- Establishes and maintains positive communication and relationships within Musqueam First Nation, other government departments,
- Participates in the Process Facilitation team for the MST Protocol Working group and other Lands files: support teams to disseminate information and serve as the logistical point of contact for crown governments and agencies.
- Work collaboratively with multiple departments at other First Nations on projects within shared traditional territory.

- Lead or participate in projects as required
- Represent Musqueam First Nation at meetings, conferences, and regional sessions, internal and external committees as required.
- Prepare and/or coordinate:
 - Correspondence for management, briefing materials for the IGA DL/Associate Director, reports, monitor budgets, departmental goals, etc.
- As delegated, responsible for direction or supervision of TLR staff, contractors, archaeology monitors, coop students and/or interns hired to complete educational projects on behalf of the department.
- Assists in budget development and expenditure and ensures balanced budget at year end.

The MIB has built a Geographic Information System Unit under the Treaty, Lands, and Resources (TLR) Department to integrate information from a number of departments within the Band's administration with a focus on treaty and reconciliation measures, community planning, traditional use studies, and fisheries access.

Reporting to the Senior GIS Specialist, the GIS Data Technician will assist with data modelling and data maintenance for our web-mapping products. 

Dehydration:

- ⇒ Dehydration occurs when your body loses too much fluid. This can happen when you stop drinking water or lose large amounts of fluid through diarrhea, vomiting, sweating, or exercise.
- ⇒ Not drinking enough fluids can cause muscle cramps and you may feel faint.
- ⇒ Usually your body can reabsorb fluid from your blood and other body tissues. But by the time you become severly dehydrated, you no longer have enough fluid in your body to get blood to your organs, and you may go into shock, which is a life-threatening condition.

Musqueam is looking for Community Champions to participate in a training series this summer to help keep our neighbourhoods safe.


SAFE HAVENS will be created, to provide a safe home for members to go to, if they ever need to flee a violent situation on reserve.

These programs are available to any First Nations individuals. Status, non-status, Métis or Inuit (priority is given to Squamish Nation members).

Introduction to Construction Worker—Scaffolding (May 9-July 15, 2016)

Construction Workers will erect basic scaffold structures understanding safe practices and hazard awareness for Frame Scaffolding. This program also includes two weeks of safety training/certification.

Piping Foundation (May 9, 2016-January 27, 2017: 36 week program)

This program trains individuals on all necessary foundational skills required for the Piping Industry including construction site safety, safe work practices, and practical knowledge. Upon completion students will write an ITA exam for Year 1 Apprenticeship in: Plumbing, Pipefitting, Steam-fitting/Sprinkler-fitting. This program also includes two weeks of safety training/certification.

Carpentry Foundations (May 23, 2016-February 3, 2017: 35 week program)

Students will cover first year theory for their Carpentry Apprenticeship. The practical portion of the program will develop skills to use hand tools, power tools, and construct residential framing and concrete formwork projects. Upon completion students will write an ITA exam for Year 1 Apprenticeship in Carpentry. This program also includes two weeks of safety training/certification.

Program funding includes:

- \$100/week training incentive
- Start up tools for work practicum after completing program
- Travel Assistance—Rides from Squamish can be arranged
- Steel toed boots
- Rain gear
