Chum Salmon Opening

Section 35.1

Dates & Times: 48hours

Saturday October 08th, 2016 0800h (8:00am) – Monday October 10th, 2016 0800h (8:00am)

Species and Quantity

The Fishery is limited to a harvest of: **Chum Salmon** with an incidental harvest of chinook and coho salmon.

All efforts and attempts shall be made to return all non-target species including all sockeye (wild and hatchery marked), steelhead, sturgeon to the water alive and unharmed.

Sockeye salmon, steelhead and sturgeon must not be retained

Use if Fish

Fish caught under this license are for food, social and ceremonial purposes. Without prejudice to future agreements, regulations, sale of fish caught under this license is **not permitted**.

Gear

The following gear is permitted to be used:

6 1/4" Mesh restriction

Drift Nets on condition that:

- (i) Nets do not exceed a maximum of 50 fathoms or 300 feet in length and a maximum depth of 60 meshes.
- (ii) Each Participant fishes only one net.
- (iii) Only one net is fished from any vessel.
- (iv) Each net is attended at all times by the Participant who is fishing the net.
- (v) No vessel fishing under the authority of this licence has on board, in a hung condition, any net that does not meet the conditions in (i) above.
- (vi) Spare nets on board a vessel actively fishing are kept in a stowed condition.

Set Nets on condition that:

- (i) Nets do not exceed a maximum of 10 fathoms or 60 feet and a maximum depth of 60 meshes.
- (ii) All Set Nets are identified by a floating buoy prominently displaying the Participant's designation number, and the Participant's designation number is the only numbers displayed on the buoy,
- (iii) All Set Nets fished from poles have buoys attached to the end of the net farthest from the beach by means of a tag line of sufficient length to allow the buoys to be on the surface of the water and clearly visible for inspection at all times.

The Musqueam Fisheries Department asks that NO fishing from the Musqueam Slough to the mouth of the North Arm in order to conserve all returning Salmon to the Musqueam Creek.

Musqueam Designated Fishers ONLY! All non-designated fishers will be escorted off the fishing grounds

Musqueam Boat Ramp Replacement Project

Construction information

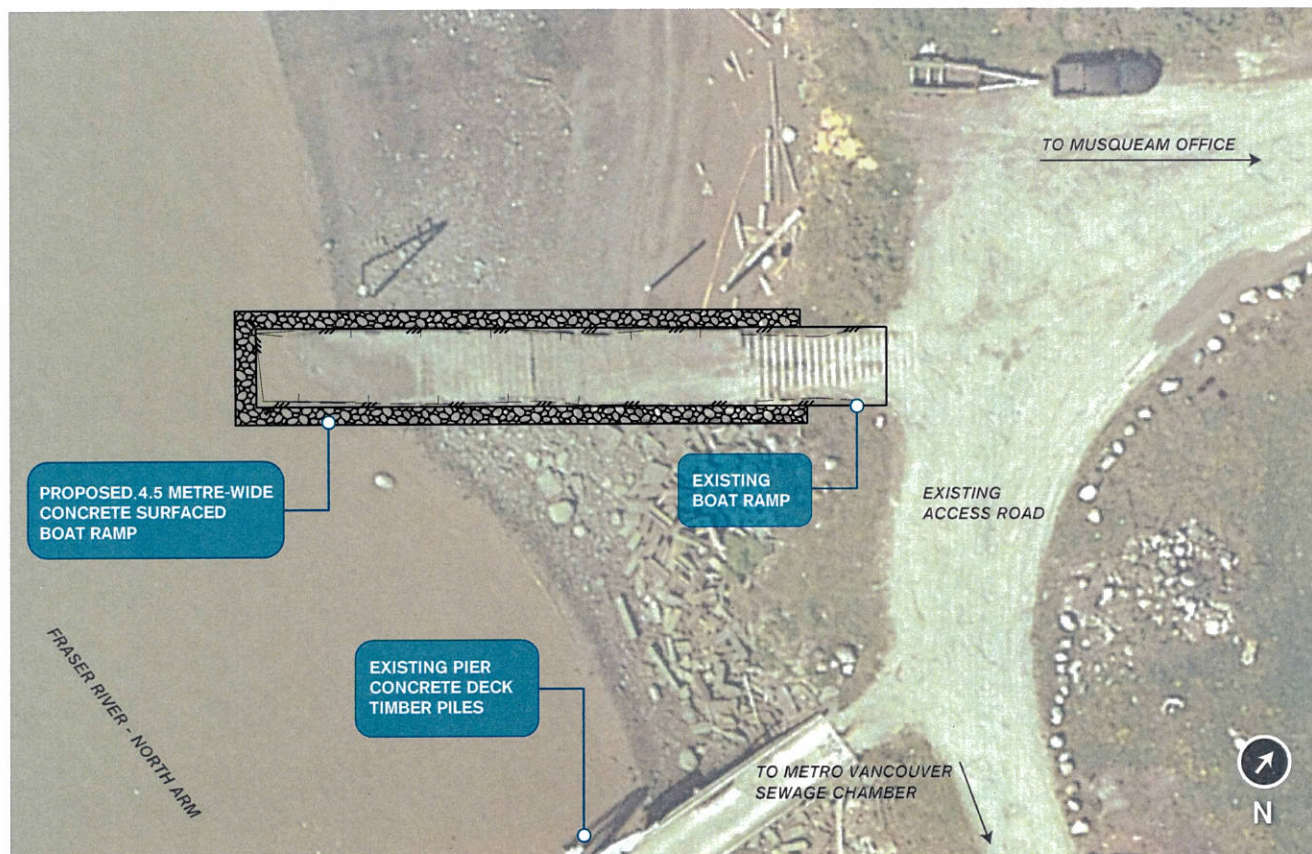
About the project:

The Musqueam Indian Band is working with the Vancouver Fraser Port Authority on the Musqueam Boat Ramp Replacement Project. The project site is located on the north arm of the Fraser River within the Musqueam Indian Reserve. This collaborative effort will involve the demolition of an existing concrete boat ramp and the installation of a safer, more functional concrete boat ramp on the Musqueam foreshore.

Construction:

Construction is expected to begin as early as October 2016 for a five-week period. Works will include the excavation and demolition of the existing boat ramp, and the installation of riprap and the new boat ramp. Due to tidal restrictions, some night works are anticipated. The community will be notified in advance of night works.

You may see contractors on site in advance of construction.

NOTICE OF NOMINATION MEETING

Notice is hereby given that a meeting of the Eligible Electors of the Musqueam Indian Band, will be held in the **MUSQUEAM COMMUNITY CENTRE GYMNASIUM (6777 SALISH DRIVE VANCOUVER, BC V6N 4C4) ON OCTOBER 18TH, 2016 BEGINNING AT 6:00 PM AND LASTING FOR AT LEAST THREE HOURS**, for the purpose of nominating candidates for positions one (1) Chief and ten (10) Councillors for the next ensuing term.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION ABOUT THE NOMINATION OF CANDIDATES:

1. Any elector may nominate candidates by delivering or sending by mail, email or fax to the Electoral Officer a completed, signed and witnessed nomination and voter declaration form to the Electoral Officer before the time set for the nomination meeting, OR by making a nomination orally at the nomination meeting.
2. Under the *First Nations Elections Act*, an elector must not nominate more than one candidate for the position of chief and no more candidates for the position of Councillor as there are Councillor positions available for election.
3. The Council of the Musqueam Indian Band has set out a candidate fee in the amount of \$100.00 for the position of Chief and \$100.00 for the position of Councillor.
4. Under the *First Nations Elections Act*, a nominee does not become a candidate until they deliver to the Electoral Officer or Deputy Electoral Officer, by 6 p.m. on October 21st, 2016 a signed *Candidate Declaration* form, which can be obtained from the Electoral Officer. The candidate fee for the relevant position must be received by this time as well, in the form of cash, certified cheque money order or electronic transfer payable to the Electoral Officer.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION ABOUT THE ELECTION:

1. The election will be held at the Musqueam Community Centre Gymnasium (6777 Salish Drive Vancouver, BC V6N 4C4) on November 30th, 2016 from 9:00AM to 8:00PM.
2. There is no Advance Poll for this election.
3. Any elector may vote by mail-in ballot by submitting a Request for Mail-In Ballot Form, which can be obtained from the Electoral Officer, along with a copy of identification, prior to November 30th. The elector is responsible for ensuring they request their mail-in voting package in a timely manner to ensure it can be received and returned via regular post and received by the Electoral Officer on or before November 30th, 2016.
4. Any elector may permit the electoral officer to release their name to the candidates.

MUSQUEAM INDIAN BAND 2016 ELECTION INFORMATION

**Musqueam Indian Band is Changing its Election System
What Voters Need to Know.**

Please read ALL the attached information carefully.

The election of the Chief and Councillors of the Musqueam Indian Band used to be held under the *Indian Act* election system. But the next election will be held under the *First Nations Elections Act*.

What is the *First Nations Elections Act*?

The *First Nations Elections Act* is a law that offers new and improved rules for elections. It was developed in consultation with First Nations organizations in different parts of Canada. The law is optional. Musqueam Indian Band Chief and Council see many benefits to elections being held under this new system and have made a choice to move to it.

Highlights - Key Changes for the next Election

- ✓ The term of office for Chief and Councillors elected at this election will be 4 years.
- ✓ All persons wishing to be a candidate for chief must pay a \$100 fee, and all persons wishing to be a candidate for councillor must pay a fee of \$100.
- ✓ To become a candidate, all persons who have been nominated must sign a candidate acceptance form and pay the appropriate fee. If the Electoral Officer does not have the signed form and the fee by 6 p.m. on the third day following the nomination meeting, the nominee is not a candidate and will not appear on the ballot.
- ✓ Mail-in ballots will no longer be automatically sent out to all off-reserve electors. Anyone who wants a mail-in ballot will have to fill in a form asking for one and send it to the Electoral Officer, who must receive it no later than the 6th day before the election. The form must be accompanied by one piece of identification that proves who the person is (like a status card, a driver's licence or a health card).

Under the direction of the Intergovernmental Affairs Divisional Lead, the Environment & Stewardship Coordinator will be responsible for water (non-fisheries), land and environment program within Musqueam's Traditional Territory. The Coordinator will provide manage, support, internally and externally, on policy, programs and projects related to Musqueam environment and stewardship issues. In addition, the coordinator will focus on the protection, enhancement and restoration of ecosystem and habitat and other MIB stewardship initiatives. The Coordinator will provide direction and provide advice on matters related to Stewardship within Musqueam Traditional Territory. In addition, the Coordinator will develop and maintain relationships across government and non-government institutions and organizations that impact Musqueam stewardship initiatives.

Duties:

- Serve as primary Musqueam liaison on environment and stewardship initiatives;
- Understand and evaluate the possible impacts projects will have on Musqueam use, interests, and proven rights;
- Project management of restoration projects including marine, estuarine and river environments in Musqueam Traditional Territory;
- Manages, reviews, analyzes and provides advice on water and land tenures in Musqueam Traditional Territory;
- Manage stewardship program which can include but is not limited to: Emergency Response, Spill Response & Readiness, Compliance and Monitoring and Cumulative Effects.
- Establishes and maintains positive communication and relationships within Musqueam First Nation, other government departments, various organizations and First Nation partners to ensure interests and expectations of these groups are identified and responded to.
- Leads or participates in projects as required and/or delegated - ability to manage projects which includes, but not limited to, coordinating resources, ensuring appropriate consultation, ongoing and final reporting.
- Leads or participates in sub meetings related to large projects in order to coordinate information for multiple departments across the organization. Follow up, develop responses, collect and disseminate information.
- Develop, manage and implement a Lower Fraser Stewardship Management Plan;
- Give assistance to various Musqueam departments on an as-needed basis;
- Assist in generating resources from third parties;
- Develops and manages departmental budgets;
- Manage timelines and deliverables for projects with deadlines; and
- Assists in coordinating relevant Musqueam projects and services.
