# UPDATE ON LDB PROJECT

### THE PARTNERSHIP AND PROJECT

In 2014 the Musqueam Community, at a General Band Meeting, approved the formation of a partnership consisting of the Musqueam Nation, the Squamish Nation, the Tsleil-Waututh Nation, and the Aquilini Investment Group. The partnership was formed to acquire and develop the property that is currently the Liquor Distribution Branch (LDB) on Broadway in Vancouver. The Partnership will develop the property at LDB and to assist with implementing this vision, a member from each partnering Nation was hired by Aquilini in March 2016 to act as the Development Coordinator for their First Nation.



This property at 3200 E. Broadway is approximately 36,000 m². We hope to create a mixed-use area that will add value to the neighbourhood in terms of employment and housing while providing sustainable profit for the partnership.

Tara Felix was hired as the Development Coordinator for Musqueam and will be working alongside the Musqueam Chief and Council, Musqueam Capital Corporation, as well as with our partnering Nations, Squamish and Tsleil-Waututh. The main objective in this position will be to keep our Communities informed as the Project progresses through its various stages.

### **FACTS ON DRINKING WATER**

### Coliform Bacteria - Total Coliforms & E.Coli

- Total coliforms are a group of bacteria commonly found in the environment, for example in soil or vegetation, as well as the intestines of mammals, including humans.
- Total coliform bacteria are not likely to cause illness, but their presence indicates that your water supply may be vulnerable to contamination by more harmful microorganisms.
- Escherichia coli (E.coli) is the only member of the total coliform group of bacteria that is found only in the intestines of mammals, including humans.
- The presence of E.coli in water indicates recent fecal contamination and may indicate the possible presence of disease-causing pathogens, such as bacteria, viruses, and parasites.
- Although most strains of E.coli bacteria are harmless, certain strains, such as E.coli 0157:H7, may cause illness.

### **Sources**

Total coliforms and E.coli are used as indicators to measure the degree of pollution and sanitary quality of well water, because testing for all known pathogens is a complicated and expensive process. The main source of pathogens in drinking water is through recent contamination from human or animal waste, from

- Improperly treated septic and sewage discharges
- Leaching of animal manure
- Stormwater runoff
- Domestic animals or wildlife

During and after precipitation, bacteria and other harmful microorganisms from any of these sources may be washed into rivers, lakes, or groundwater. Poor well construction or poor maintenance can increase the risk of groundwater contamination.
