BC Wild Fire

Effective at 12noon Friday, July 7, 2017 within the Coastal Fire Centre's jurisdiction (BC Parks, Crown lands and private lands), campfires will only be allowed on Northern Vancouver Island, the mid-coast portion of the mainland and on Haida Gwaii.

Backyard fire (open fires) **BANNED:** a fire bigger than 1ft 8inches in height and in width and is used by any person for recreational purpose, or by a first nation for a ceremonial purpose, due to hot and dry conditions of the summer predictions

<u>Campfire</u> (semi-closure) <u>BANNED</u>: a fire no higher than 1ft 8inches in height and in width and is used by any person for recreational purpose, due to hot and dry conditions of the summer predictions

River fire (open fire) **BANNED:** is bigger than a backyard fire close to a dry grassy area, due to hot and dry conditions of the summer predictions

<u>Propane fire</u> (controlled) <u>Permitted</u>: controlled propane fire-pit is permitted even when all others are banned



Paving and Road Closures Dunbar and Crown Street

The City is experiencing some logistics delays on site and were unable to pave through Dunbar intersection Tuesday, July 25th. The Updated plan is to start paving at Dunbar from 7am to 11am Thursday, July 27th.

Paving Crown Street intersection will commence on Saturday, July 29th. More specific closure timeline will be updated when a better understanding of paving progress. Paving work is scheduled to commence at W.41st intersection at 6:30 am on Sunday July 30th. This paving work is scheduled on Sunday morning in an effort to be in compliance with City's Traffic Management requirements. Paving will require temporary closure at the intersection and lower traffic volumes are expected on early Sunday morning. The project has been granted a Noise Bylaw Exception.

The City will arrange additional Traffic Authority personnel to re-route traffic.





As a Family Member of a Missing and Murdered Indigenous Women and Girls (MMIWG), we would like to extend the offer for you to apply to attend our first free "Sisters in Strength Wellness Retreat" happening at Sts'ailes Lhawathet Lalem in Agassiz starting on Friday October 13 and ending Sunday October 15, 2017.

Our organization is a small non-profit called the **BC Bereavement Helpline**, we have been providing grief and loss support services across the province for approximately 30 years now.

Our intention is to bring together Indigenous women to connect and share in each other's strength, to create a positive atmosphere for women in a sacred, trauma and culturally-informed environment. We are still in the process of creating the program for the two days that we will be spending together. We have developed some possible activities such as a Blanketing Ceremony, the creation of Cedar roses, art-therapy, beauty treatments such as hair-cuts, healing circles of support, information session(s) about trauma and more. You are most welcome to share with us any other activities you would like to see happen at this gathering and we will see if it's possible to meet that request.

Spaces are limited to 25 Indigenous women who have a loved one of the MMIWG and able to travel to the Facility in *Sts'ailes* Traditional Territory. Accommodations for two nights, 6 meals, snacks and all activities happening at this retreat will be provided free of cost to all the women who are selected to participate at this event.

Knowledge keepers will be present on site to guide us and provide support to the women. Other support people will also be present, most of whom have also experienced a traumatic loss of a loved one.

Due to the unconfirmed start dates relating to the *National Inquiry into Missing and Murdered Indigenous Women and Girls* which have not yet been publicly announced, we will be creating a waitlist for family members who are wishing to attend, just in case some of the selected women are unable to attend due to a date conflict for the hearings said to commence in the Fall.

Some additional information for support services, in 2011, the *BC Victims of Homicide Program* was created to specifically support family members who have lost a loved one to murder. You can find more information on our websites at: www.bcbh.ca and www.bcvoh.ca.

BC SERVICES CARD

By 2018 -All eligible adults must renew enrolment in MSP by February 2018 and get a BC Services Card.

The BC Services Card can also be combined with a driver's licence.

Plus, using ICBC's existing identity proofing and renewal processes helps keep everyone's personal information more secure and helps

prevent fraud such as identity theft or misuse of government services.

Eligible adults (19 and older) can get a BC Services Card when they enrol in MSP or when they renew their driver's licence or BCID. Children and youth under 19 do not need to renew enrolment in MSP and, if they don't have one already, are automatically issued their first Non-Photo BC Services Card when an adult on the account contacts Health Insurance BC or obtains their own BC Services Card.

- MSP Changes Adults 19 to 74 years of age are required to renew enrolment in MSP. The BC Services Card has replaced the CareCard and the Gold CardCard.
- One card = easy access In the future, the BC Services Card will provide easy access to many other provincial services.

Fees There is no fee to get a BC Services Card. However, if you're combining your BC Services Card with your driver's license, fees that apply to the regular <u>driver's license issuance process</u> still apply.

How to get a BC Service Card: Visit an ICBC driver licensing office with two pieces of ID. Bring your CareCard if you have it

Check your driver's license and CareCard to be sure your name matches exactly on both. If not, call Health Insurance BC at 604 683-7151 or 1 800 663-7100.

SAFE DRINKING WATER MONITORING PROGRAM

How should a water cooler be cleaned?

Reservoir: (Note: Clean your bottled water cooler before every bottle change.): Unplug cord from electrical outlet of cooler; 2. Remove empty bottle (carboy), 3. Drain water from stainless steel reservoir(s) through faucet(s). 4. Prepare a disinfecting solution by adding one tablespoon (15 mL) household bleach to one Imperial gallon (4.5 L) of water solution.

Drip Tray (located under faucets): Lift off drip tray; 2. Remove the screen and wash both tray and screen in mild detergent; 3. Rinse well in clean tap water and replace on cooler.

Replacing Bottle: Wash hands with soap and warm water before handling. If you choose to use clean protective gloves (ex. latex), discard or disinfect after each use and prior to reuse. (Some companies suggest using one-part vinegar to three parts water solution to clean the reservoir of scale before cleaning with bleach. Check your manual.)

Note: Other disinfecting solutions may be suitable. Please check with your water cooler supplier/manual.




